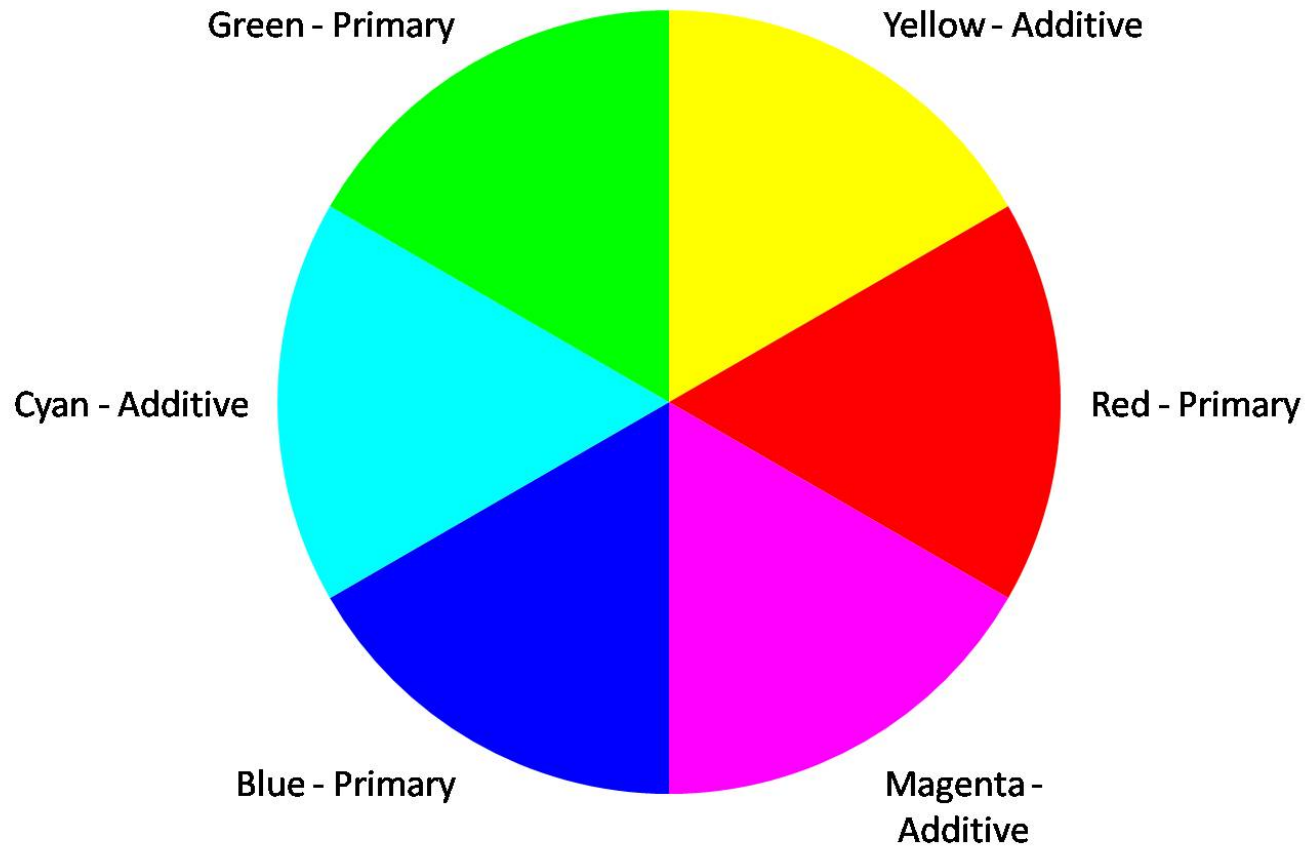

Colour Schemes

- Monochromatic
- Analogous
- Complementary
- Triadic



Monochromatic

- Involves only one colour
- Hues are employed to allow variance across the design
- Dark through to light
- Harmony within the confines of one colour presentation



Analogous

- Colours adjacent to each other on the colour wheel
- Similar colours
- Vary only slightly from each other across the colour scheme



Complementary

- Located opposite each other on the colour wheel
- Examples of red and green, yellow and purple, orange and blue
- Work well together
- Fresh, exciting, and very dynamic pattern



Triadic

- Primary colours
- Equally spaced on the colour wheel
- Red, Green, Blue (RGB) for example
- Exciting colours, vibrant and produce a lively result
