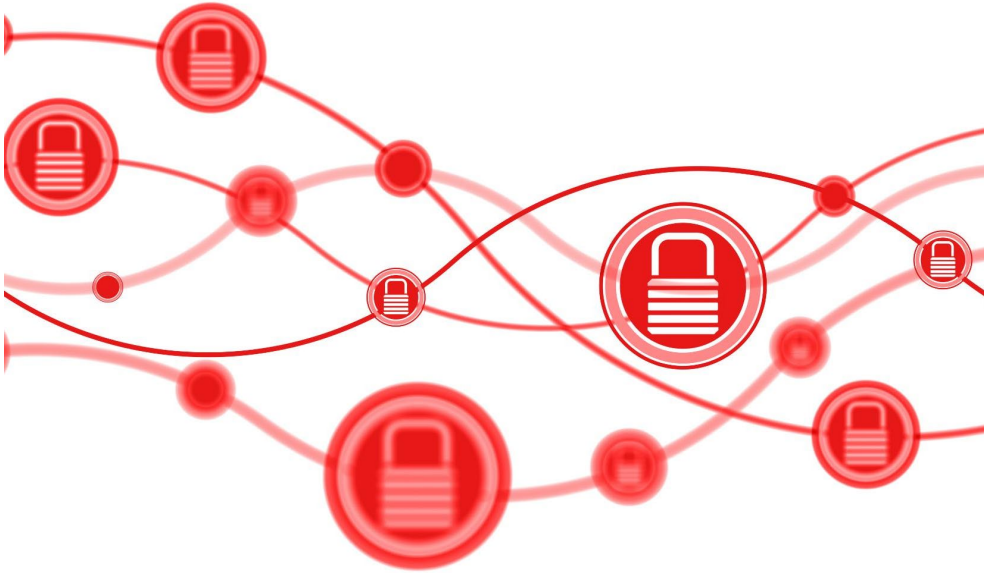

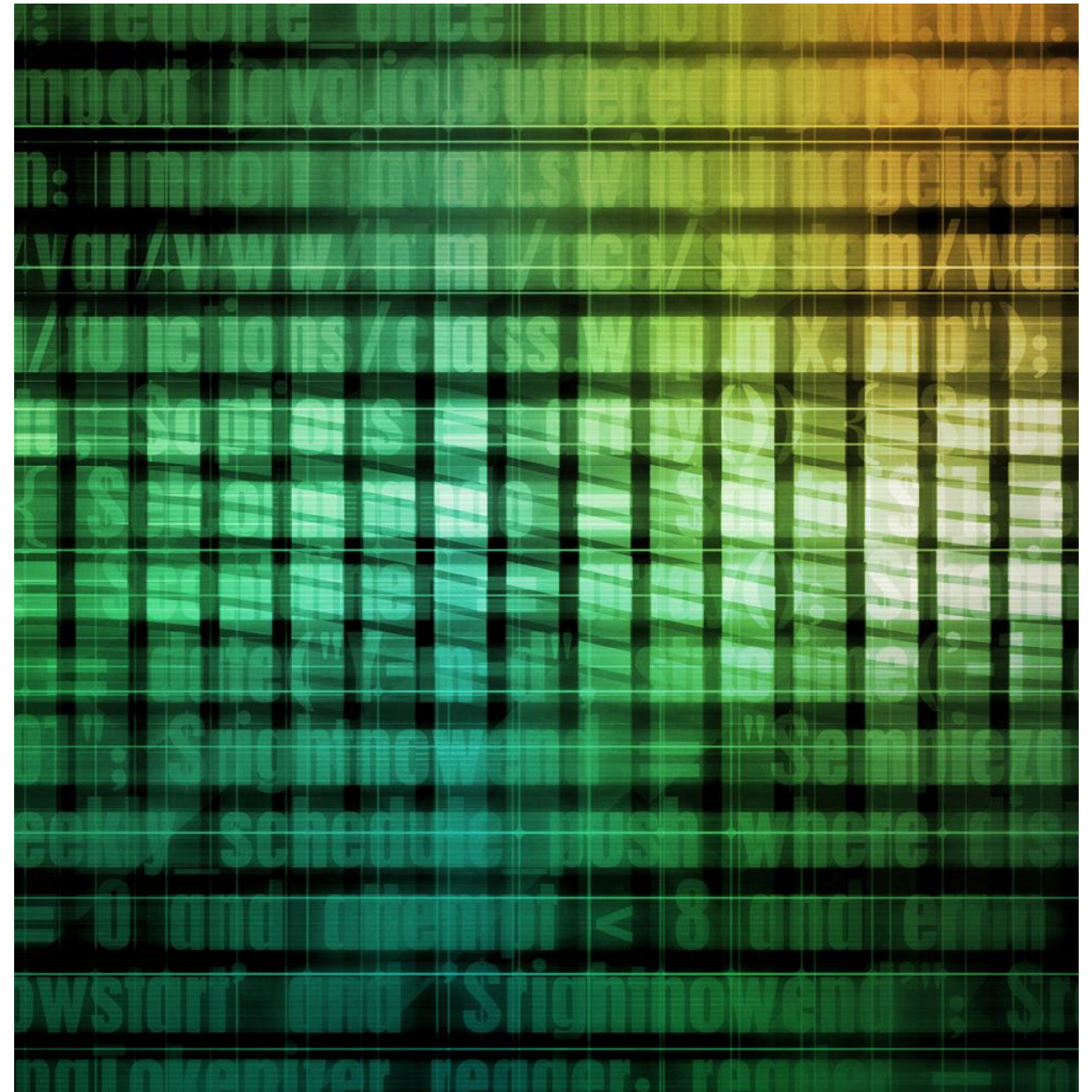
ISO/IEC 27001 & 27002

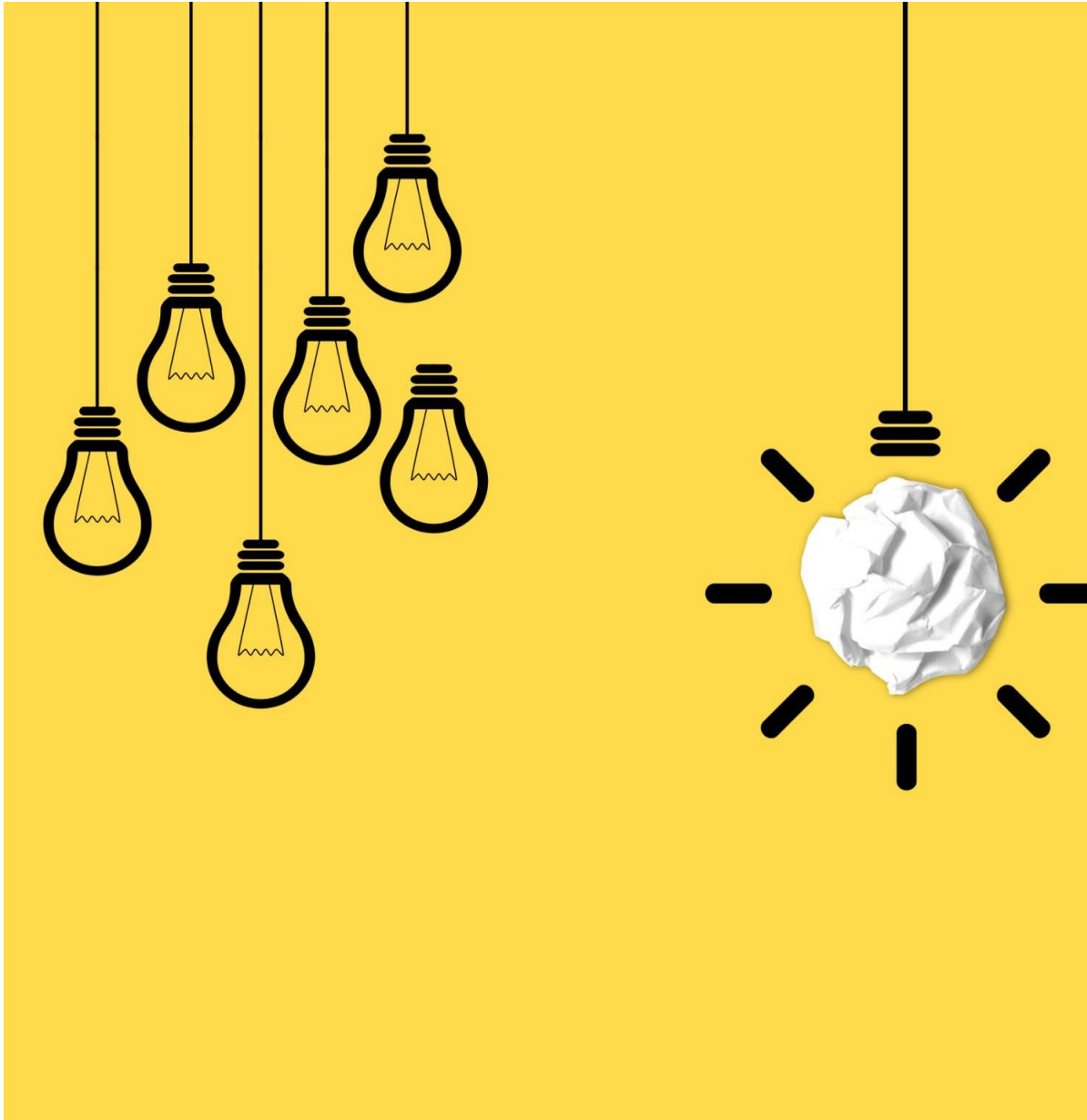
