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Bold and Italics

- Introduction to other text formatting tags:

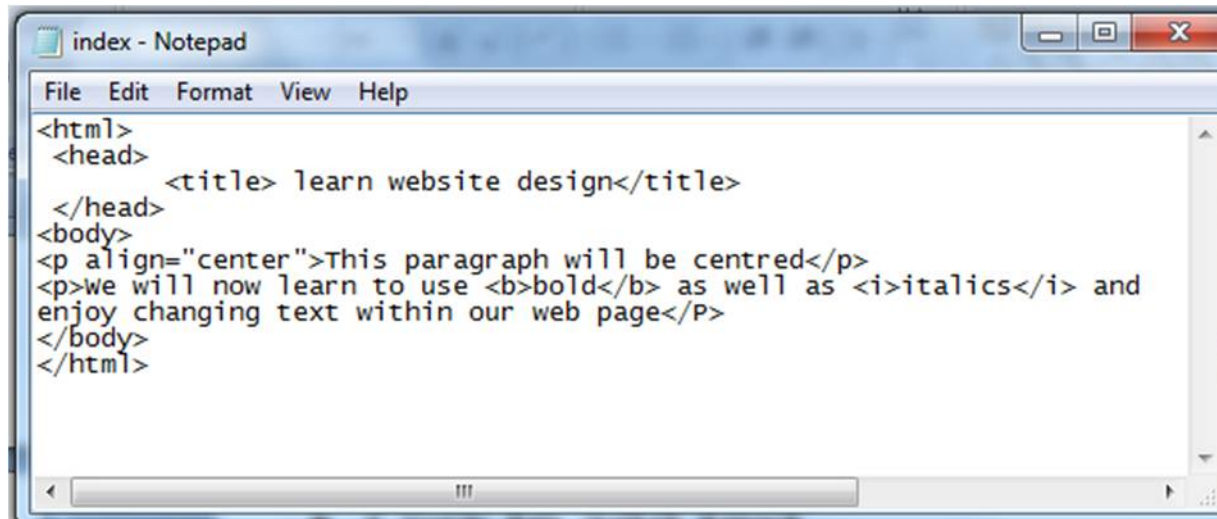
`<b> this would be in bold</b>`

`<i> this would be displayed using italics </i>`

- Again, notice the requirement for the closing tag – this also ends the instruction for the formatting, meaning the formatting of text can be applied to specific sections as well as large sections of text



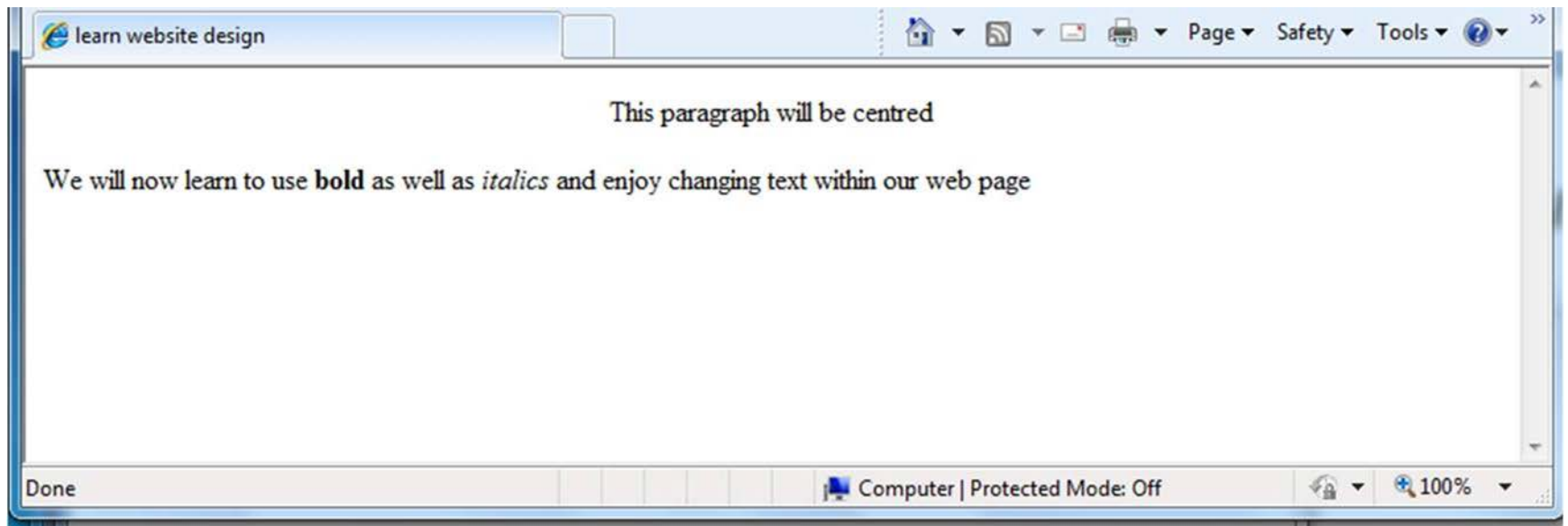
Bold and Italics - Notepad

Togetherhness

- Container tags can be used in conjunction with each other
- For example, **bold** and *italics*

`<b><i>`***this will be bold and in italics***`</i></b>`

- Notice the end tags and the order to which they are served – this is known as ‘nested’
- Another example:

`<b><i><u>`***it will be bold, italic and underlined***`</u></i></b>`

- It does not matter which order you apply bold, italics, underline... it could very well be italics, bold and underline, or underline, italics, bold. As long as you have the end tags in the relevant nesting order
