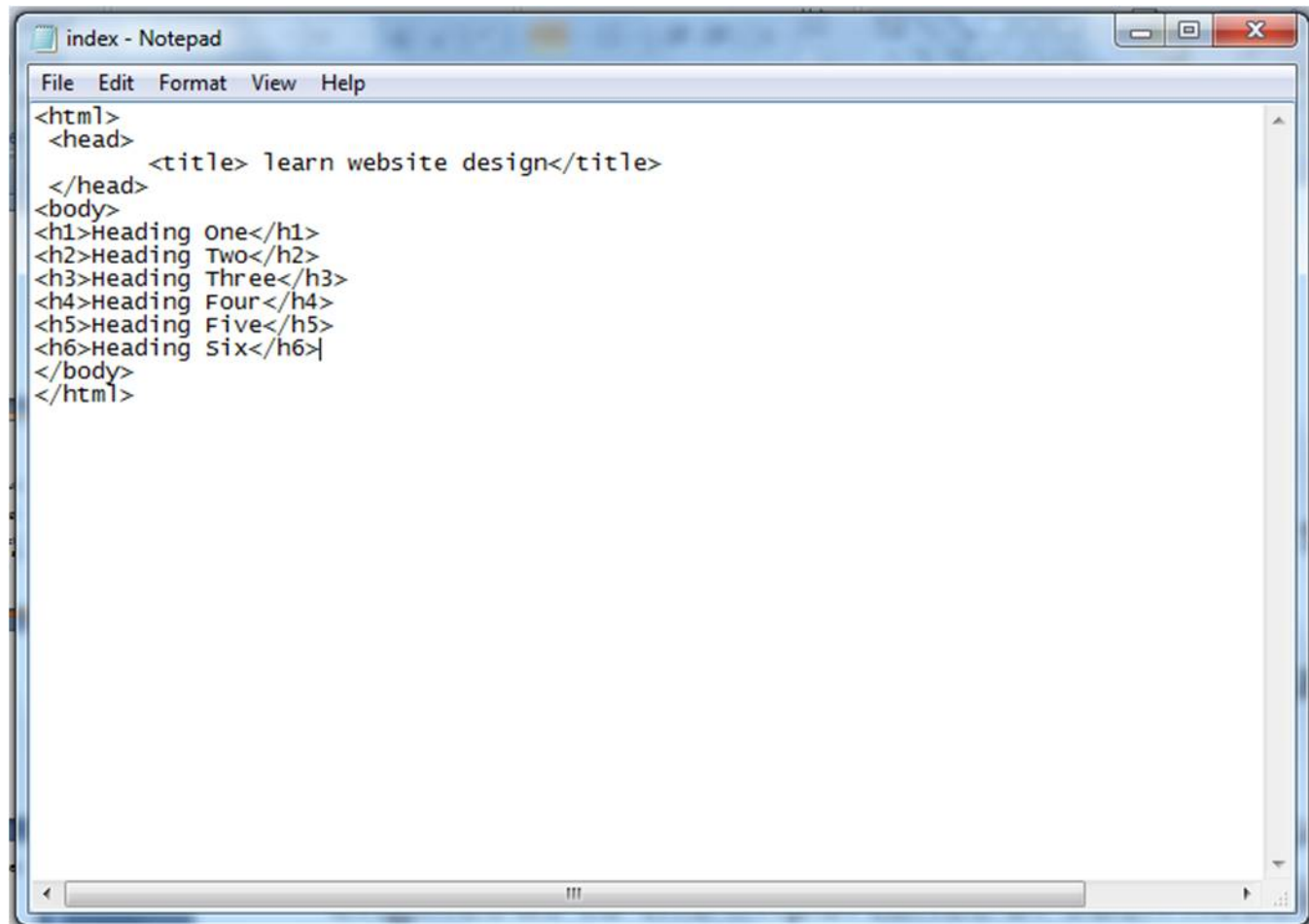

Headings

- Heading tags contain preset instructions pertaining to size of font and how the text should be displayed as a heading or sub-heading
- There are 6 levels, coded with the h for heading and the level number, for example: `<h2>`
- Heading tags also contain information for search engines as to the importance of such headings as opposed to other normal reading text within a web page



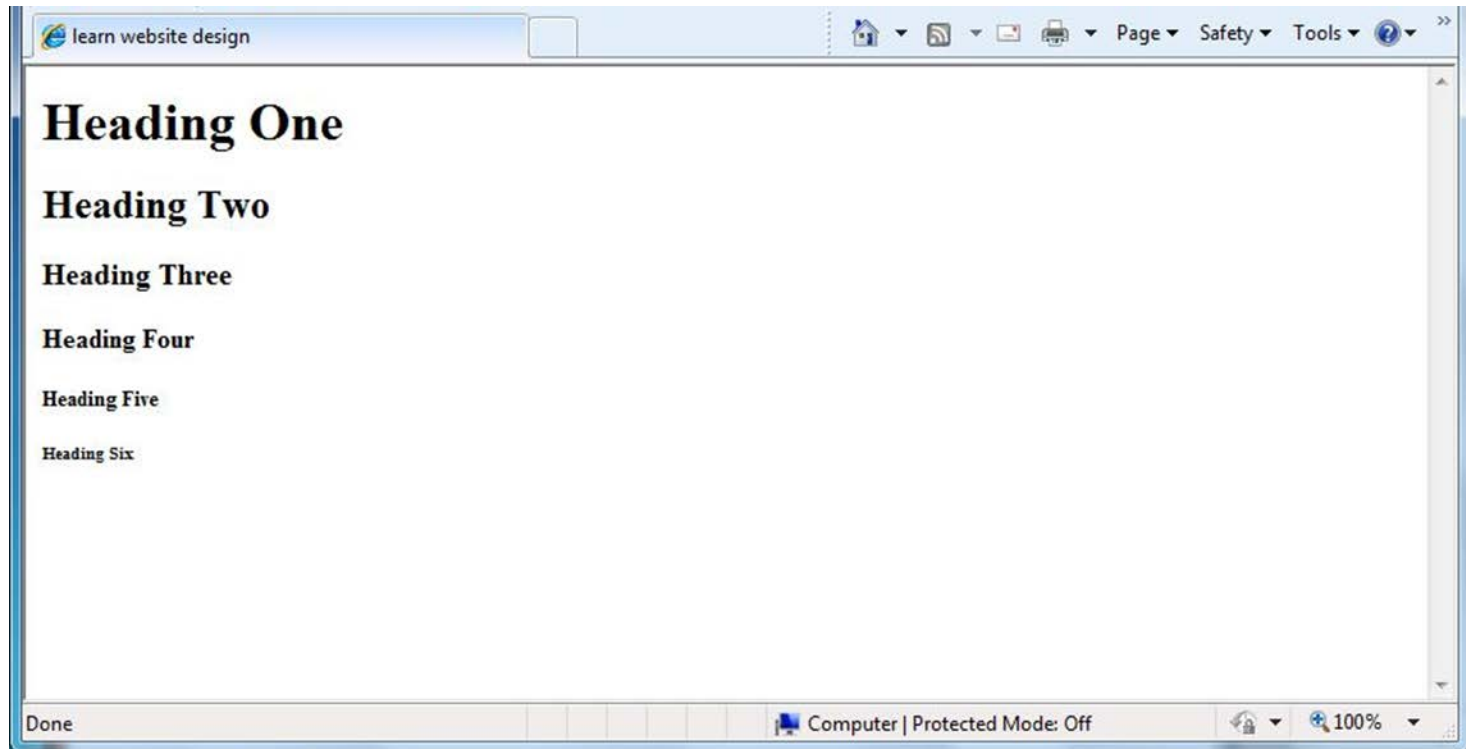
Headings as code

Note

- Headings automatically employ a new paragraph, meaning the `<p>` paragraph tag is not necessary
- The same applies to the use of bold
- Notice the different formatting for each level
- Each level can be used as many times as you require throughout a web page. For example, you might wish to use Heading 1 x 3 times, Heading 2 x 5 times and Heading 3 x 10 times...the web designer determines the use of heading tags
